

Selectmen's Meeting – April 25, 2005

Mr. Silvia, Mr. Eckenreiter and Mr. Manzone were present.

Also in attendance was Jeffrey Osuch.

Mr. Silvia called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Mr. Eckenreiter motioned to approve the minutes of April 11, 2005. Mr. Manzone seconded. Vote was unanimous.

NSTAR HEARING

NSTAR Electric Hearing for one pole on David Drown Boulevard was called to order at 7:00 p.m. Abutters were notified by certified mail of the date and time of the hearing. None were present. Mr. Eckenreiter motioned to approve the petition. Mr. Manzone seconded. Vote was unanimous. (Petition approved by the Board of Public Works.)

EXECUTIVE SECRETARY'S REPORT

Mr. Osuch will attend the meeting with DEP on April 26th at 9:30 a.m. to discuss the West Island Waste Water Treatment Plant.

Mr. Osuch and Mr. Silvia will tape the pre-Town Meeting show on April 27th at 4:30 p.m.

Finance Committee will meet on April 28th at 7:00 p.m. at the Board of Public Works.

Cable Advisory Committee will meet at 6:30 p.m. on April 28th at the Town Hall.

A letter was received from George A. Woodbury regarding the acquisition of streets lights. (See attached.) An article to purchase the lights appears on the Annual Town Meeting Warrant. An appointment will be scheduled on the May 2nd agenda to discuss the matter with Mr. Woodbury.

Anyone interested in appointment should submit a letter to the Selectmen's Office by 4:00 p.m. on Monday, May 9th.

COUNCIL ON AGING

Mr. Silvia read the letter from the Council on Aging regarding the appointment of Council members. (See attached.) The Board stated Associates are non-voting members. When a vacancy occurs on the Council, the Associate is then appointed a full member. No action will be taken to place an article on a Town Meeting Warrant.

HARBORMASTER/SHELLFISH DEPARTMENT

Mr. Silvia read the letter of resignation from Shellfish Warden, Dan Costa. His resignation is effective May 19th. The Board thanked Mr. Costa for a job well done. The vacancy was taken under advisement.

Mr. Silvia read the letter from the Harbormaster regarding the appointments of Harbormaster Assistant/Deputy Shellfish Warden/Parking Control Officer and Bryan Wood's letter requesting appointment. (See attached.) Mr. Eckenreiter motioned to appoint Bryan Wood, James Almeida, Roger Souza, Don Gifford, Jason Patterson, Steven Horsley, William Morell and Tom Perkins, Harbormaster Assistant/Deputy Shellfish Warden/Parking Control Officer. Mr. Manzone seconded. Vote was unanimous. Terms to expire May 31, 2006.

PERSONNEL BOARD

On April 12th, the Personnel Board voted to approve a \$10,000. stipend for Fire Chief Tim Francis as EMS Director, with said funds to be paid from the Town's Ambulance Account, to approve a 2% raise for FY 05 for all non-union employees and to approve a 2% roll-up in salary for FY 06 for all non-union employees. The Fire Chief was present and discussion followed on his request for the EMS Director stipend. Mr. Eckenreiter motioned to support the \$10,000. stipend for the Fire Chief, effective July 1, 2005, with said funds to come from the Ambulance Account. Mr. Manzone seconded. Vote was unanimous. Mr. Eckenreiter motioned to support the 2% raise and 2% roll-up in salary in

FY 06 for all non-union employees. Mr. Manzone seconded. Vote was unanimous. Mr. Eckenreiter, a member of the Personnel Board, stated this year the Personnel Board will initiate an annual review of all non-union employees.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

Mr. Silvia read the letter from the Police Chief regarding the appointment of a full time officer. (See attached.) Mr. Eckenreiter motioned to appoint Kevin Viveiros a full time Police Officer. Mr. Manzone seconded. Vote was unanimous.

Mr. Silvia read the letter from the Police Chief requesting a "No Parking" area on the west side of Arsene Street. (See attached.) Mr. Eckenreiter motioned to approve the request. Mr. Manzone seconded. Vote was unanimous.

The Police Chief will be asked to make a recommendation for parking control on Green Street adjacent to Cushman Park in the vicinity of the track.

SRPEDD

Mr. Eckenreiter motioned to re-appoint Al Borges to the SRPEDD Commission. Mr. Manzone seconded. Vote was unanimous. Mr. Borges will represent the Board of Selectmen. Term to expire May 31, 2006.

Mr. Eckenreiter motioned to re-appoint William Roth to the Joint Transportation Planning Group (JTPG) and to re-appoint Robert Carey the alternate. Mr. Manzone seconded. Vote was unanimous. Terms to expire May 31, 2006.

HOMECOMING DAY FAIR

Mr. Silvia, a past president of the Improvement Association, left the room when the Homecoming Day Fair was discussed.

Mr. Eckenreiter read the letter from Myra and Curtis Lopes requesting permission to hold the annual Fair on Saturday, June 25th from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. (See attached.) Mr. Manzone motioned to approve the request. Mr. Eckenreiter seconded. It was so voted.

DOUBLE UTILITY POLES

Mr. Silvia read the letter from Hilmar Gundersen regarding double utility. An appointment will be scheduled with NSTAR Electric to discuss the issue.



In response to your questions I am providing some additional information in regards to the acquisition of streetlights. The Electric Utility Industry Restructuring Act of 1997 included a provision to allow communities the right to purchase their streetlights from their local utility company. The legislation was affirmed in November of 1998 and went into affect in March of 1999. In the fall of 2000 the Town of Lexington along with the Town of Acton were the first communities to take advantage of that legislation after almost a year of negotiations and hearings to resolve the calculation of the purchase price. Since that time nearly 60 communities have acquired their lights or are in the process of acquiring their streetlights. Attached is a list of those communities.

The primary reason communities purchase their lights is the cost savings and in the case of some communities to have greater control over lighting decisions and repair response times. My experience in the ComElectric service territory is the shift to community ownership and contract maintenance results in improved service. It is expected that the purchase price of your streetlights will be one dollar as it has been for all other ComElectric customers. The Town has 1369 streetlights. Using the current tariffs and estimated maintenance costs based on current bid prices the estimated savings for the Town would be roughly \$34,000 per year.

The typical steps to acquiring the streetlights are as follows,

1. Request purchase price information from the utility, which you have already done.
2. Complete a detailed economic analysis to determine benefit and payback of acquisition.
3. Notification to NSTAR of intent to purchase, triggering the sixty-day (60) clock.
4. Determination of the desired approach to maintenance and issuance of RFP or negotiations with municipal light company as applicable. Should the Town desire to enter into an intermunicipal Agreement with a municipal light company there is a requirement for the Town Meeting to vote and approve of this action.
5. Negotiation of the Purchase & Sale and License Agreements as required.



6. Completion of transaction and notification of citizens of the change. Update of any Town publications to reflect reporting procedures for outages.
7. Energy efficiency upgrades to increase savings. This is normally included as a part of the maintenance contract.



I have assisted with securing maintenance contracts with private vendors, with municipal utility companies, through intermunicipal agreements and in house maintenance services. one member to be elected at large. The initial Board shall be elected at the first annual town election after the passage of this Act, and shall consist of three (3) members elected by the Town to serve for a term of three (3) years; two (2) members elected by the Town to serve for a term of two (2) years; two (2) members elected by the Town to serve a term of one (1) year. The member elected at large and the first two in order of votes received of members so elected shall serve three (3) years, the second two in such order shall serve two (2) years, and the remaining two in such order shall serve one (1) year. Thereafter, when the term of any member expires, his successor shall be elected to serve for three (3) years. In all cases, the members of the Board shall serve until their successors are qualified. The members of the Board shall, after each annual town election, elect from its members a chairman and a clerk for the ensuing year. In case of a vacancy, the Board of Selectmen shall, within thirty (30) days, fill such vacancy until the next town election, when a new member or members shall be elected to fill the unexpired term. No person shall serve on the Board who is an employee of any town agency coming under the jurisdiction of the Board of Public Works.

Section 2: Upon the election and qualification of the initial members of the Board of Public Works, the Board shall have all the powers and duties now and from time to time vested by general or special laws, town charter or town-by-laws in the following boards, departments, and offices having corresponding powers and duties in the Town of Fairhaven, to wit: Highway Department, Water and Sewer Commissioners, Park Commissioners, Cemetery Commissioners, Refuse and Garbage Collection, and with respect to construction and maintenance only, the Town Dump and such boards, offices, and departments shall be abolished. No contracts or liabilities then in force shall be affected by such abolition, but the Board of Public Works shall in all respects be the lawful successor of the boards, departments, and offices so abolished.

The Board shall have such additional powers with respect to the furnishing of engineering services, the maintenance and repair of town buildings and property, and the performance of such duties of any other boards, departments and offices of the


Dear Mr. Golas,

RE: Request for No Parking Area

Gentlemen:

I respectfully request the Board vote to designate as a No Parking zone an area on the west side of Arsene Street adjacent to Route 6. Specifically, the area runs approximately 79' from the curb line of Rt. 6 along the west side of Arsene Street to a driveway at the rear of 241 Huttleston Avenue.

This request originated with Highway Superintendent John Charbonneau due to the inability of two vehicles to enter and exit Arsene Street at the same time when a vehicle is parked in this area. This often results in vehicles being backed up onto Rt. 6 waiting to turn onto Arsene Street because of vehicles trying to exit Arsene Street. The situation is exacerbated due to the number of trucks which enter and exit Arsene Street.

I have examined the situation and completely agree with the assessment of Superintendent Charbonneau.


Dear Selectmen
