

Selectmen's Meeting – December 11, 2006

Mr. Silvia and Mr. Manzone were present. Mr. Eckenreiter was absent.

Also in attendance was Jeffrey Osuch.

Mr. Silvia called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Mr. Manzone motioned to approve the minutes of November 27, 2006. Mr. Silvia seconded. It was so voted.

Mr. Manzone motioned to approve the minutes of the November 27, 2006 executive session (7:45 p.m.). Mr. Silvia seconded. It was so voted.

Mr. Manzone motioned to approve the minutes of the November 27, 2006 executive session (8:00 p.m.). Mr. Silvia seconded. It was so voted.

HOWARD'S AUTO SALES

Mr. Manzone stated he has a conflict of interest (family relationship) and can not vote on the Class II Dealer's License application submitted by Howard Katz, for Howard's Auto Sales, 10 Arsene Way. Mr. Manzone motioned to continue the hearing to December 27th. Mr. Silvia seconded. It was so voted. If Mr. Eckenreiter is absent on December 27th, Mr. Manzone will vote using the "rule of necessity".

PUBLIC HEARING

REQUEST FOR NO PARKING ZONE ON SOUTH SIDE OF HOWLAND ROAD

A public hearing was scheduled for 7:15 p.m. to discuss a request for a No Parking Zone on the south side of Howland Road between Oak Street and Sycamore Street. Mr. Silvia read the notice of hearing sent to abutters. (See attached.) Several abutters and the Police Chief were present. The petitioner, Michael Furtado, was not present. The Police Chief summarized his recommendations on the request. (See attached.) In a letter dated October 20th, the Chief stated "I have no particular objection to Mr. Furtado's request to also post the south side of the street but am concerned about the reaction of other residents who live on that block and would be forbidden to park in front of their homes. Further, these residents will have to park somewhere so parking may become a premium on streets close to that block impacting other resident who live in the area." Abutters stated they have no off street parking and this change would be a major inconvenience. They don't want a No Parking Zone. The Board agreed not to change the parking.

AL'S AUTO SALES

Alan Desroches submitted a Class II License application for Al's Auto Sales, 322 Huttleston Avenue. (Former Murray's Auto Sales – change of name and owner only.) Mr.

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Desroches was present. Mr. Manzone motioned to approve the application. Mr. Silvia seconded. It was so voted.

UNION WHARF SMALL BOAT REGULATIONS & INSURANCE REGULATIONS

Gary Golas was in attendance and reviewed the Union Wharf Small Boat Basin Regulations draft. Section 4-6 Insurance was specifically discussed as were docking license fee dates. Also reviewed were the Proposed Union Wharf Regulations dated December 7th. Insurance requirements were discussed. Mr. Golas will get more information on insurance for both the small and larger boats for the December 27th Selectmen's Meeting. Mr. Manzone stated small/large boats are commercial vessels and there shouldn't be a distinction.

105 SCONTICUT NECK ROAD

Robert Sylvia, owner of property at 105 Sconticut Neck Road, was in attendance to discuss the use of the property. He gave a brief background on the property and the types of businesses that have/are renting the site after the closing of Executive Coffee. He wants to continue renting the building, but did say it is up for sale. Brief discussion followed. The Board stated the use of the property is in litigation and both Mr. Silvia and Mr. Manzone want to speak with Town Counsel on the matter.

SEAFOOD SERVICES

Robert Wexler of the Tron Group, 53 State Street, Boston and Jeffrey Pontiff were in attendance to discuss the building on Union Wharf previously occupied by Seafood Services. The building, with the exception of a 900 foot ± section in the center, belongs to the Town. The 900 ± section is owned by Seafood Services. Seafood Services declared bankruptcy. Mr. Wexler stated he is attempting to come up with a solution for the building. He suggested drafting an agreement to share money from the sale of the building between the Town and Seafood Services and sell the entire building. Brief discussion followed. Mr. Silvia and Mr. Manzone agreed selling waterfront property is not an option.


Mr. Manzone motioned to approve renewal of the Private Livery License for Elite Transportation, Inc. Mr. Silvia seconded. It was so voted.

Gentlemen:

I received a copy of the written request from Michael Furtado for a No Parking Zone on the south side of Howland Road between Oak and Sycamore Streets from your office for review and comment.

As you are aware, I submitted a letter to you on September 26, 2006 in response to Mr. Furtado's earlier letter to you complaining about noise from trucks parking on Howland Road in the early morning hours and my efforts to mitigate the problem. I attach a copy of that letter in the event any of you may have misplaced your copies.

I submitted a request to you earlier in the year to post the north side Howland Road in that area as a no parking zone. You approved that request and the north side was appropriately posted.


I have no particular objection to Mr. Furtado's request to also post the south side of the street but am concerned about the reaction of other residents who live on that block and would be forbidden to park in front of their homes. Further, these residents will have to park somewhere so parking may become a premium on streets close to that block impacting other residents who live in the area.

Gentlemen:

The Board of Health is pleased to inform you that the Massachusetts Department of Public Health has listed the West Island Town Beach on Fir Street as a Tier III Status Bathing Beach. This listing indicates the bathing waters at the beach to be very clean through the bathing season and will allow the Board of Health to test the bathing water once every 30 days throughout the 2007 bathing season versus the presently required once every seven (7) days.

The testing variance has been granted based on several factors including the water quality of the beach over the past several years, the flushing capacity of the bathing waters, and other environmental qualifications as noted in the enclosed report. A sanitary survey of the site was performed by a Massachusetts Registered Sanitarian and was required for the variance request. The Board is pleased to note that the survey was done through a grant secured by the Board.

In conclusion, we believe the notification that the West Island Town Beach is verified as a Tier III Status Bathing Beach by the Department of Public Health is a significant accomplishment for the Town and its residents. The Board is pleased to have served the community in this endeavor. Additionally, we have been notified that the Causeway Road Beach will be surveyed for the same status if funding remains available.






