

Selectmen's Meeting -- June 20, 2007 at 7:00 p.m.

At North Fairhaven Improvement Association Building  
(Old Fire Station -- Oxford School)

Present: Ronald Manzone, Michael Silvia, Brian Bowcock, Jeffrey W. Osuch. Also approximately 15 NFIA members.

Ronald Manzone called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

The Selectmen listened to comments, complaints, suggestions, etc. from NFIA members about issues in North Fairhaven.

John Medeiros concerned with traffic, vehicle noise, etc.

1. Lights at Main Street and Howland Road -- left turn should be allowed to move traffic from Main Street to Howland Road. Also right turn on red.
2. Worn out or missing lines and signage at Adams Street
3. Now that Oxford School closed -- remove No Parking signs in front
4. Restrict braking noise and speeding on Main Street
5. Restrict truck traffic on side streets
6. Need radar, police control speeding
7. Need signs at Bridge and Alden Road - turn signs missing

Natalie Hemingway -- requested guard rail at NW corner of Main and Howland Road

Issue of enforcement of Stop Sign at Alden Road at Acushnet line

General discussion of impact of Home Depot Mall on traffic on Howland Road. Town Planner will be monitoring the development. Police Chief to be contacted.

Vandalism in Livesey Park -- "Tagging" -- need for security cameras -- BPW and Police Chief to look into possible connection to Comcast line at Oxford School.

Acushnet resident raised the issue of truck traffic on Main Street and the issue of extending Route 240 into Acushnet. Discussion on "looping" wetlands, full cloverleaf, assistance from Senator Montigny, Representative Straus, District 5 Mass Highway.


Request to post Sycamore Street "No Trucks". Signs on Main Street and other streets no "jake breaking".
