#### Charter Information

#### What is a Charter?

A Town Charter is a constitution for your town. It clarifies how a town government functions and operates. A Town Charter describes the basic laws, principles, powers and duties of a town. It explains the responsibilities of the Selectboard, Town Administrator, Town Meeting, all Boards and Committees.

#### Why a Charter Now?

The Town of Fairhaven is governed by a series of bylaws that were enacted over a long period of time. A Town Charter provides clarity in our government structure. It can also serve as a guide for Town Officials, employees, and YOU, residents of our community, on how our government functions.

#### Charter Process

- Appointed nine member
  Fairhaven Charter Committee
  conducts study of current and
  comparable governments
- Reports are vetted with public review and Mass General Court
- Final report is brought to Town Meeting to allow voters to vote on charter
- If approved at town meeting, town wide voters will vote to either approve or reject adoption of a charter
