1) December 12th Meeting

2) PSC sheet review

- * PSC
- * Chris explains the chart
- * Note: Costs are estimates based on spoken discussion
- * will be a living document
- 3) Cherry Sheet Overview

- * Governor budget vs our own budget analysis
- * Increase of 1.5% over FY 20, was hoping for more
- * Ch.70, had hoped we'd get more but didn't occur
- * Assessments taking away from budget
- * School Choice, increase in 40k
- * Chapter School, similar cost issue
- * Receiving slightly less than 70% increase
- * Bernie: Estimate of how many students? Mark: Superintendent will get back with more numbers
- * Projected: 3% in Ch.70 increase, only 1.7%, deficit 90k
- * Net decrease of 194k increase over what was projected
- * Pad: Veterans came down? Mark: Provided less, trying to get more on Federal vs. state
- * Pad: State-wide changes to education cost? Mark: Revamped the formula, urban school systems are the main beneficiary; Ch.70 went up, but redistributed differently
- * Carolyn: Set or estimate? Mark: Firm numbers based on census data, Ch.70 is likely to change, almost always increases, won't be till after town meeting
- * Pad: Sending as total or per student? Mark: Formula driven process based on models
- 3) Capital Fund Project Plan
- * Departments submit plans
- * Received less than 8.7m
- * Doesn't include the PSC or renovations to historic properties
- * Capital Planning rank based on 8 criteria (see plan included), also meet with department heads
- * 2.7m for FY21
- * Bernie: Athletic fields artificial? Mark: Yes
- * Bernie: Seems like a high price
- * Jessica believes it was already renovated
- * Chris comments about using the criteria to understand the cost
- * Wendy mentions of the field flooding now
- * Free cash, little more than 2m after last town meeting, projects are funded through this amount
- * Recommend to raise 200k for school, borrow for 1.2m for project
- * 4.3m in capital stabilization, reserving amounts for FY22 and PSC (land acquisition)
- * FY22 Capital stabilization funds used for projects
- * Tracy: 200k can be raised? Mark: Yes, can be raised and in trust fund
- * Carolyn: Can we use non-profit money? Mark: We explore grants and please pass on information to others
- * Pad: 1.2m falls into debt services? Mark will explain more
- * Breakdown of the debt service repayment of turf (1.2m)
- * Breakdown of non-excluded debt added over the years
- * Paying off debt from fire truck can allow for more debt to be paid
- * Using debt service as a financing tool to take care of large projects
- * Can't rely on free cash, so using financial policies/debt services to figure out how to pay off bigger ticket items
- * Fairhaven has not used debt servicing as a financing source previously
- * Carolyn: Figures don't include PSC? Mark: Not included
- * Jessica: How are debt services structure? Mark: Treasurer sets, talks with finance advisor

- * Bernie: Ball park for debt exclusion on PSC? Wendy: No hard figure yet
- * Chris: Additional to tax payer now? Mark: Within the budget of the 2.5% levy increase
- * Debt services takes away from operating budget, main trade-off

Closing Remarks

- * Discussion of figure heads to meet between Pad, Wendy, and Mark
- * Doesn't include enterprise funds
- * General Fund Operating Budget goes before Selectmen Feb. 14
- * Jessica: Didn't we just do radios? Mark: Problem for many different departments
- * February 6th would review capital budget with department heads
- * Pad requests Wendy to set up meetings
- * Won't be discussing the PSC right away, need to take care of standard documents and projects first
- * February will mostly be budget discussions, March will be discussing the articles
- * End of March will be voting more
- * Deadline will be April 2nd for the book
- * Chris: PSC an article? Mark: Selectmen discussed how to handle the PSC in executive session
