  - i. SJP 2019-15 Mazda Signage Plan
- ii. <u>SP 2019-13 Lewis Landing/Huttleston Multi-Unit Rentals</u>: Revised stormwater plans for proposal to create twelve 2-bedroom rentals in four buildings on Huttleston Ave.

**Planning update:** Mr. Foley advised that the Crow Island rezone that was approved by Town Meeting has been approved by the Attorney General. They have contacted him hoping for a meeting in late January. Mr. Foley said he is waiting for contracts from the state for the Union Wharf feasibility study and will then send out a RFP.
