On June 5, 2017 the Board of Selectmen voted to set the following updated charge for the Economic Development Committee:

- 1. That the Board of Selectmen approve the following mission statement for the committee: "The mission of the Fairhaven Economic Development Committee is to enhance the existing business community, attract new business, attract new customers, and encourage redevelopment and new development as may be advisable in order to increase the Town's property tax revenues, income, job base and overall economic health."
- 2. Regarding the composition of the Committee, the membership shall consist of six (6) atlarge members with ties and experience in Fairhaven, to be appointed by the Board of Selectmen; one representative member from the Board of Selectmen; and one representative from the Planning Board, to be appointed by the Planning Board. The Planning and Economic Development Director shall serve as non-voting ex-officio staff member.
- 3. All terms shall be one year terms.

Amended by vote of the Board of Selectinen on August 17, 2020 to add an additional at-large member, and remove the Town Administrator as a non-voting ex-officio staff member.





My wife Heather is a Special Education Teacher, working for 17 years in the Hingham Public School system. We have 2 children, Violet and Ella who are in the Fairhaven School system. Violet will be heading to Hasting Middle School this coming year and Ella will be heading into 2nd Grade. Violet is currently on 504 plan for heath and Ella is on IEP for Speech. We have navigated these services in the Fairhaven system, learning about the school-based systems that are in place and experiencing them firsthand. For me, I am a License Mental Health Clinician, currently working for Southcoast Hospital Group in the Emergency Departments for St. Luke's and Charlton Memorial Hospitals. Fairhaven Marine Resources Committee Meeting Minutes: April 1, 2021

Present Via Zoom: Harbormaster Tim Cox, Chairman Mike McNamara, Robert Hobson, Andrew Jones, Selectman Robert Espindola, and Dave Hebert & Michelle Potter.

Eric Dawicki was absent.

Chairman McNamara called the meeting order at 6:30 pm.

Approval of Minutes:

Mr. Hobson made a motion to approve the March meeting minutes. Mrs. Potter seconded. Selectman Espindola would like the minutes amended to note he had partial attendance. Minutes then passed unanimously.

Harbormaster Updates:

The ramp at Seaview is being repaired. It will be put back in mid-April.

The boats have been pulled out of the shed. Some minor repairs will be done on them. All the boats are getting new radios. All boats will be launched after the installations. He is working with the Fire Department to pick a low tide in mid-April to power wash Hoppy's and possibly Pease Park boat ramps.

Mr. Hobson asked about crack in the cement at Hoppy's. Harbormaster Cox said that he would have to contact the State as they pay a percentage of that. He will contact Doug Cameron.

Chairman McNamara asked for dredging updates. Harbormaster Cox stated he spoke to Foth Engineering they will begin the study of West Island dredging with the next month. Regarding the Phase V dredging, Harbormaster Cox informed the committee that he has been meeting, along with Foth, the residents who are interested in dredging their properties to go over the timeframe and contract details.

a. Pump Out Rules & Regulations

The State requested a copy of the Town's & City's pump out rules & regulations. We don't currently have pump out rules and Harbormaster Cox would like them put into the new draft of the Waterway Rules & Regulations. He presented a drafted a copy using nearing town's current regs.

Mr. Hobson asked about boats power washing and who regulates it. Mr. Jones & Mr. McNamara established that this issue is regulated by the state.

Shellfish Updates:

a. Northeast Maritime Aquaculture Site Application

Morgan Dawicki speaking on behalf of NMI. They have requested a two-acre aquaculture site so they can use as a course of study at the school in the near future. They have submitted their request letter to the Town along with the \$100.00 down payment.

Harbormaster Cox noted that they have met with the State and plotted a preliminary area for the new site. He presented this to the committee. They are looking for Town approval to move forward. Harbormaster Cox also noted this is an 8-12 month process. Mr. Hebert made the motion to support the request form NMI. Mrs. Potter seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Progress at Union Wharf:

Harbormaster Cox displayed some pictures of the ongoing construction at the Wharf while explaining some of the work that is happening. The Town is now looking into tarring the entire wharf.

Chairman McNamara then read a letter from Town Council regarding the issue of the land swap at Union Wharf. Discussion ensued regarding opinions about the agreement.

Harbormaster Cox updated the committee on the water situation at the Wharf. He has three quotes coming shortly.

Any Other Business:

Mr. Hobson asked if the Waterway Rules & Regulations are approved at Town Meeting in June, when will they begin to be enforced. Selectmen Espindola believes as soon as it is adopted but will validate that with Town Council.

Mr. Hobson asked for an update on the opening of the coves. Harbormaster Cox stated he will be closing North Cove and opening Round & Senior. The date is to be determined by the State.

The next meeting will be May 6, 2021.

Motion to adjourn made by Harbormaster Cox, Mr. Hebert seconded. Passed unanimously.

The meeting adjourned at 7:48 pm.

Fairhaven Marine Resources Committee Meeting Minutes: May 6, 2021

Present Via Zoom: Harbormaster Tim Cox, Chairman Mike McNamara, Robert Hobson, Andrew Jones, Selectman Robert Espindola, and Dave Hebert, Eric Dawicki, & Michelle Potter.

Chairman McNamara called the meeting order at 6:30 pm.

Approval of Minutes:

Mr. Hobson made a motion to approve the April meeting minutes. Mrs. Potter seconded. Minutes passed unanimously.

Aquaculture:

Mr. Steven Doonan is in attendance with Mr. Larry Fowler. He would like to be added to Mr. Fowler's aquaculture permit. Per Harbormaster Cox, DMF as well as DPH have no issue with this taking place. Dave Hebert motioned to accept Mr. Doonan as a partial owner to Mr. Fowler's site, Michelle Potter seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Darryl Klinka and Mr. Dennis Leahey, also in attendance, are each requesting a two acre aquaculture site. Harbormaster Cox displayed a map of the proposed area. Dave Hebert motioned to accept Mr. Klinka and Mr. Leahey's proposal. Robert Hobson seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Shellfish Updates:

Harbormaster Cox shared a map from DMF. He explained that the Department of Public Health has been having issue with shellfishing in mooring areas. A survey was sent to mooring holders in the Round Cove and Seaview areas to evaluate the contamination to shellfish from the boats that have heads on them. For the time being area BB18.1 is closed and BB18.4 is conditionally approved. He also noted that he has closed North Cove as well as opened Senior and Round Cove. He is also getting ready to plant another 500 bushel. He does not have anything for the upweller this year. He is working a deal with New Bedford to help out with a propagation project they are working on in the future. Chairman McNamara asked about the baby quahogs that were grown last year. Harbormaster Cox noted they were planted in Senior Cove. Mr. Dawicki asked about the cost of getting seed for the upweller. Harbormaster Cox will make some phone calls on pricing. Mr. Dawicki believes there is grant money to be had.

Progress at Union Wharf:

Harbormaster Cox displayed some pictures of the ongoing construction at the Wharf while explaining the work. Noted we will have a new parking lot as well. It will shut down for a short amount of time. The boats will be able to return no later than the first of June.

Chairman McNamara asked about the status of the water. Harbormaster Cox is waiting for the final bids to come in then they can start work.

Harbormaster & Ramp Updates:

Harbormaster Cox put in the floats at Seaview Boat ramp. Waiting for a real low tide in order to meet the Fire Department at Hoppy's to hose down the ramp. Harbormaster Cox then displayed pictures of a boat fire at Pease Park boat ramp. There is some damage to the ramp. Waiting on the insurance company for the go ahead to fix it. In the meantime there is no safety issues.

Chairman McNamara asked for any on progress on the land swap from Selectmen Espindola. Selectmen Espindola deferred to Harbormaster Cox for any update. Harbormaster Cox asked Attorney Crotty if this issue has to go back in front of Town Meeting to be voted on and the answer was no it does not. He will work on getting the layout of the land swap. Discussion ensued regarding getting details on the swap. Information has been requested of Ms. Graves.

Committee Appointments:

Chairman McNamara addressed the board on whether or not they would like to remain on the board for the upcoming year.

Any Other Business:

Mr. Jones asked whether we have GIS mapping capabilities in Town or through the Harbormasters Office. Harbormaster Cox believes the planning has access to GIS mapping. He also noted we are trying to get on board with the Building Departments permitting program. This may have the mapping involved that we need. Chairman McNamara spoke of a few different inexpensive programs he uses that may be worth looking into as well.

Mr. Jones then asked the Board to allow him to look into shell recycling. Martha's Vineyard Shellfish Group has a recycling program where they put shells in salt ponds for oyster growth. Harbormaster Cox spoke about the Nature Conservancy receiving Covid-19 grant money and they will be planting oysters but he believes the shell program will be able to help restock Fairhaven.

Mr. Hobson mentioned the building at Hoppy's Landing needs repairing. Harbormaster Cox said he has planned to the maintenance with his crew. Mr. Hobson asked how much money is the Hoppy's Landing Revolver. Harbormaster Cox will have that for the next meeting.

Mr. Hobson asked about the rule for bringing 5 gallons containers to the boat ramp. Harbormaster Cox stated you can bring a sealed jerry jug to the boat.




Motion to adjourn made by Harbormaster Cox, Chairman McNamara seconded. Passed unanimously.

Possible Masking Mandates for Fairhaven's Municipal Buildings

Dear Chairman Espindola,

The Town of Fairhaven's COVID-19 positivity rate has risen to 5.41% as of last Friday. This means that out of the 1,276 COVID-19 tests administered to Fairhaven residents during the past two weeks, over 5% were positive. This is probably due to a number of factors, the most likely one being mostly symptomatic, i.e. "sick" people, are the main recipients of the tests. Regardless, this is a trend of concern and should be addressed. Because of this I would continue to recommend:

Face coverings should be mandated in municipal buildings beginning next week if the positivity rate has not declined. I will know next Friday morning what the rate is as that is when the data from DEP is released. However, you may wish to implement this mandate sooner instead as that is your prerogative. At this time, my recommendation is to wait until next week to implement any new face covering policies in municipal buildings. Thank you.
