The proposed scope of work is a continuation of an on-going program to restore the exterior envelope of the building. Three previous phases of window restoration work have been undertaken to improve operation and thermal efficiency of the existing window units.

Designated window sashes would be removed to an off-site facility for paint removal, repair and/or replacement of damaged wood stiles and rails, installation of more energy-efficient thermal glazing, installation of perimeter weather-stripping, replacement of missing sash lifts and sash locks, and the restoration of the original system of sash pulleys and sash weights.

Narrative:

Fairhaven High School is a jewel of a building that represents the gift of a man who saw
education as the most important tool that a community can provide to its future citizens. See
the attached MHC information and the attached 5-year master plan for more detailed
information. The existing windows are an important component of this architectural
masterpiece. They help regulate and control light and fresh air to the many classrooms and
offices within the building.

Site Control:

• The Fairhaven High School was built in 1906 and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The land and building were given to the Town of Fairhaven, as a gift by benefactor Henry Huttleston Rogers, a former resident and graduate of the high school. It has been owned by the Town since 1906 and is part of the Fairhaven Public School District.

Project Scope:

The proposed scope of work is limited to the restoration of the existing wood window sashes
and windowsills. It calls for the removal of designated window sashes to an off-site facility for
paint removal, damaged wood repair or replacement, installation of more energy-efficient
double glazing, perimeter weather-stripping, replacement of missing sash lifts and sash locks,
and the restoration of the removed pulley and sash weight balance system.
